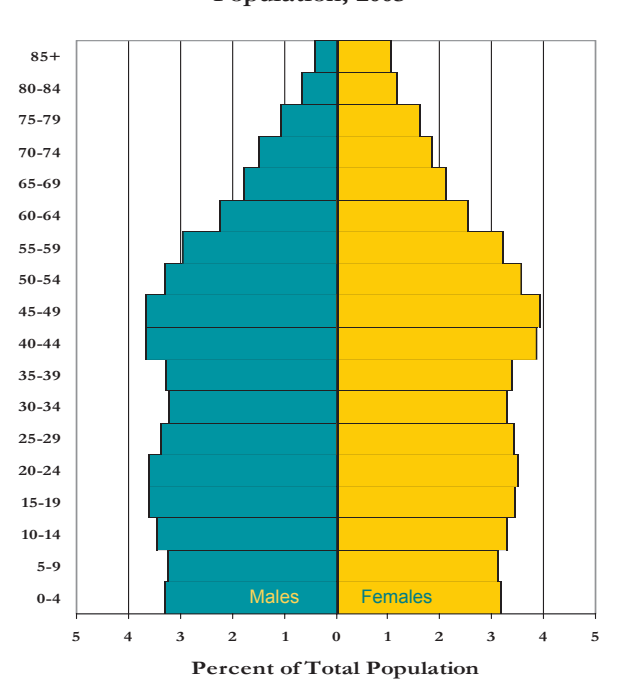

Age-Sex Distribution of the Alabama Population, 2005



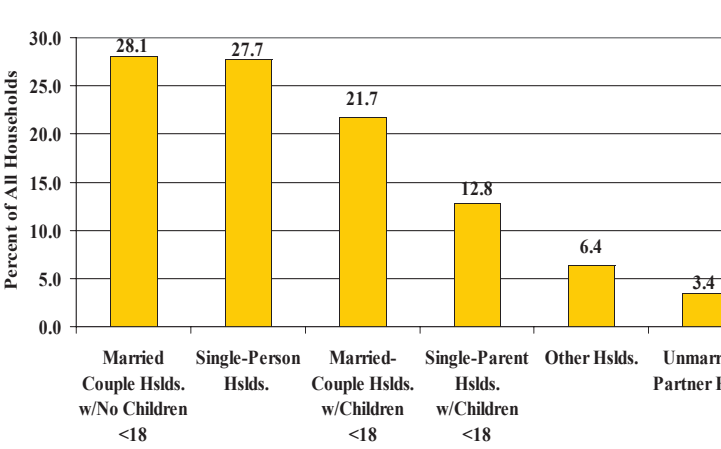

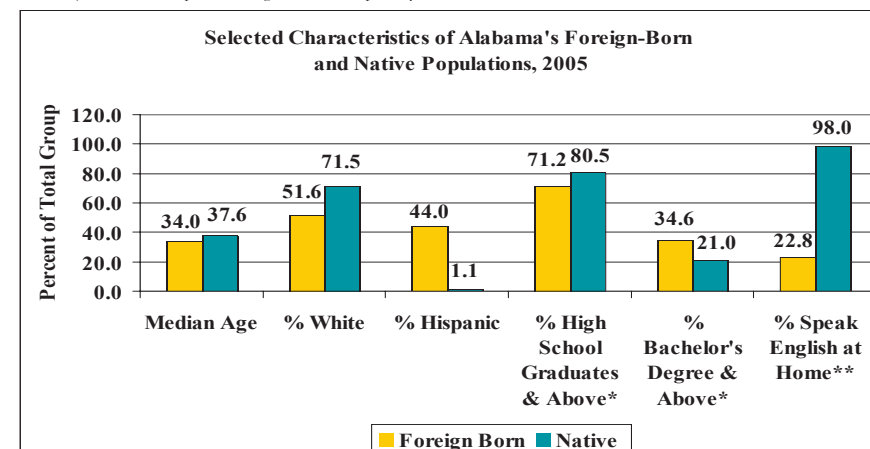
